

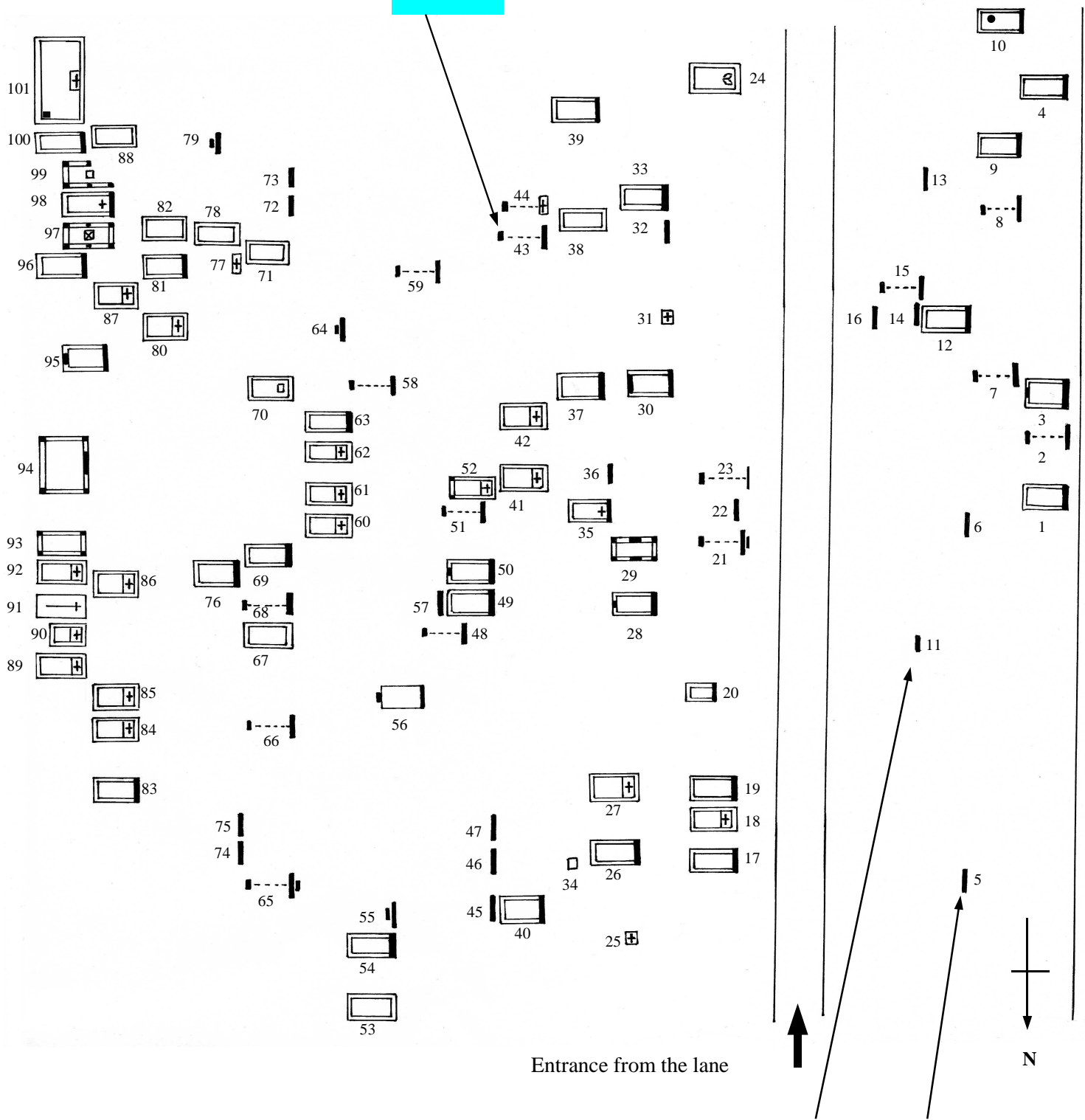
Military graves in Eynesbury Old Cemetery

Frederick Woodward

Private A. Walton, Suffolk Regiment

Died 19th January 1919 aged 20 Years

Son of Alfred and Harriet Walton, of Montague St., Eynesbury.



Private Frederick J H **Woodward**, died December 4th 1916,
aged 21 years.

On his gravestone is his mother's name, Laura Louise, who
died when he was very young and is probably also buried in
this cemetery.



Sapper George Gaunt

Rosa Young read this gravestone in the 1980s and recorded -

In Loving Memory of 10th June 1901 Aged 29 Years

Buried at Bloemfontein S. Africa Thy will be done

Also of the son Sapper Aged 36 Years

In 2015 the gravestone is lying face down and cannot be read but the footstone was recorded as L G 1904. This footstone therefore records the burial place of Louisa Gaunt who was buried on July 4th 1904.

The inscription read by Rosa Young also noted the death of two of her older brothers (1) Charles Gaunt, aged 29 yrs, who died in Bloemfontein in 1904, shortly after emigrating and (2) Sapper George Gaunt, aged 36 yrs, who was killed in October 1917 during the Great War. George is also listed on the Eynesbury War Memorial
